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Multiple sampling strategies as the accepted methods used in assessment in clinical competency include OSCE, Short Answer Questions, mini-CEX (Mini Clinical Evaluation Exerciser), Directly Observed Procedural Skills (DOPS), Clinical work sampling (CWS), and 360-degree evaluation. The assessment is an integral component of overall educational activities.

Assessment Methods in Medical Education - Students

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Assessment methods should match the competencies being learnt and the teaching formats being used. Competence is a habit of lifelong learning, is contextual (e.g. practice setting, the local prevalence of disease, etc) and developmental (habits of mind and behaviour and practical wisdom are gained through deliberate practice.

Assessment Methods in Medical Education

Various assessment methods are available to assess clinical competence according to the model proposed by Miller. The choice of assessment method will depend on the purpose of its use: whether it is for summative purposes (promotion and certification), formative purposes (diagnosis, feedback and improvement) or both.
