What Is Time-Out? Time-out is a form of discipline that can be effective in reducing challenging behaviors in young children. The term "time-out" is short for "time out from positive reinforcement." The strategy is similar to an extended form of selectively ignoring disruptive behavior.

### **The Role of Time-Out in a Comprehensive Approach for**

Time-out periods should be brief (up to 5 minutes) and may include contingent release to ensure appropriate behavior before a student leaves Time-out.
